# Rutgers Reading Club

An After School Literacy Intervention Program for Struggling Readers

Research Based
Practices

- Motivating and engaging children
- Building self-esteem
- Time for socializing and snacks
- Building relationships between student and teacher
- Allows for choice and success
- Differentiating instruction
- Provides aded time for literacy instruction in the school day
- Allowing for practice

The RRC is an after school intervention program for struggling readers focusing on the child's needs.

Teaching includes the integration of the language arts with developing: phonemic awareness, phonics, comprehension, vocabulary, fluency and writing.

Sessions are motivating with children choosing books to be read to them they can't read themselves.

Sessions are an hour twice a week for 12 weeks by certified teachers. Building relationships with the child is crucial.
