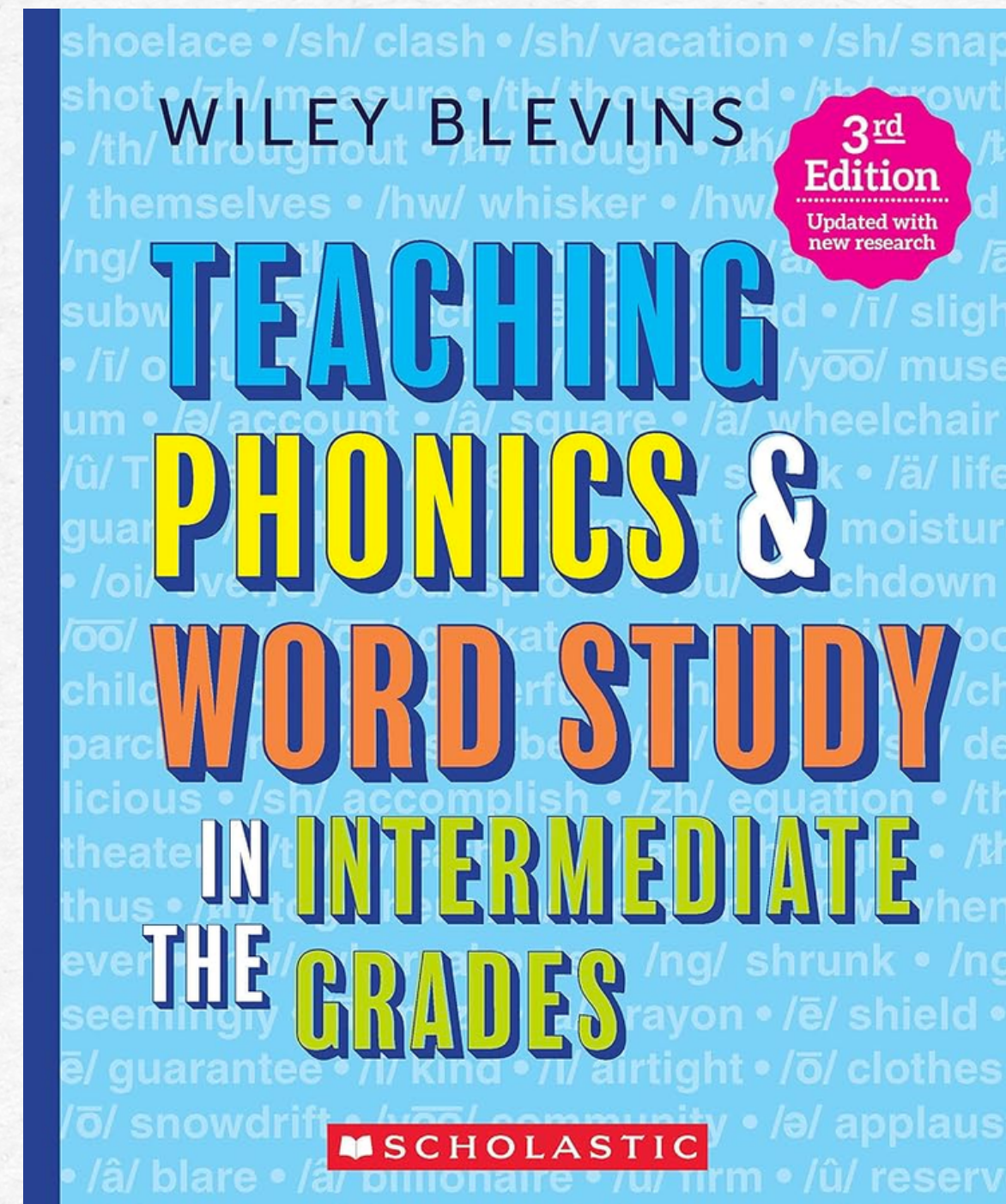

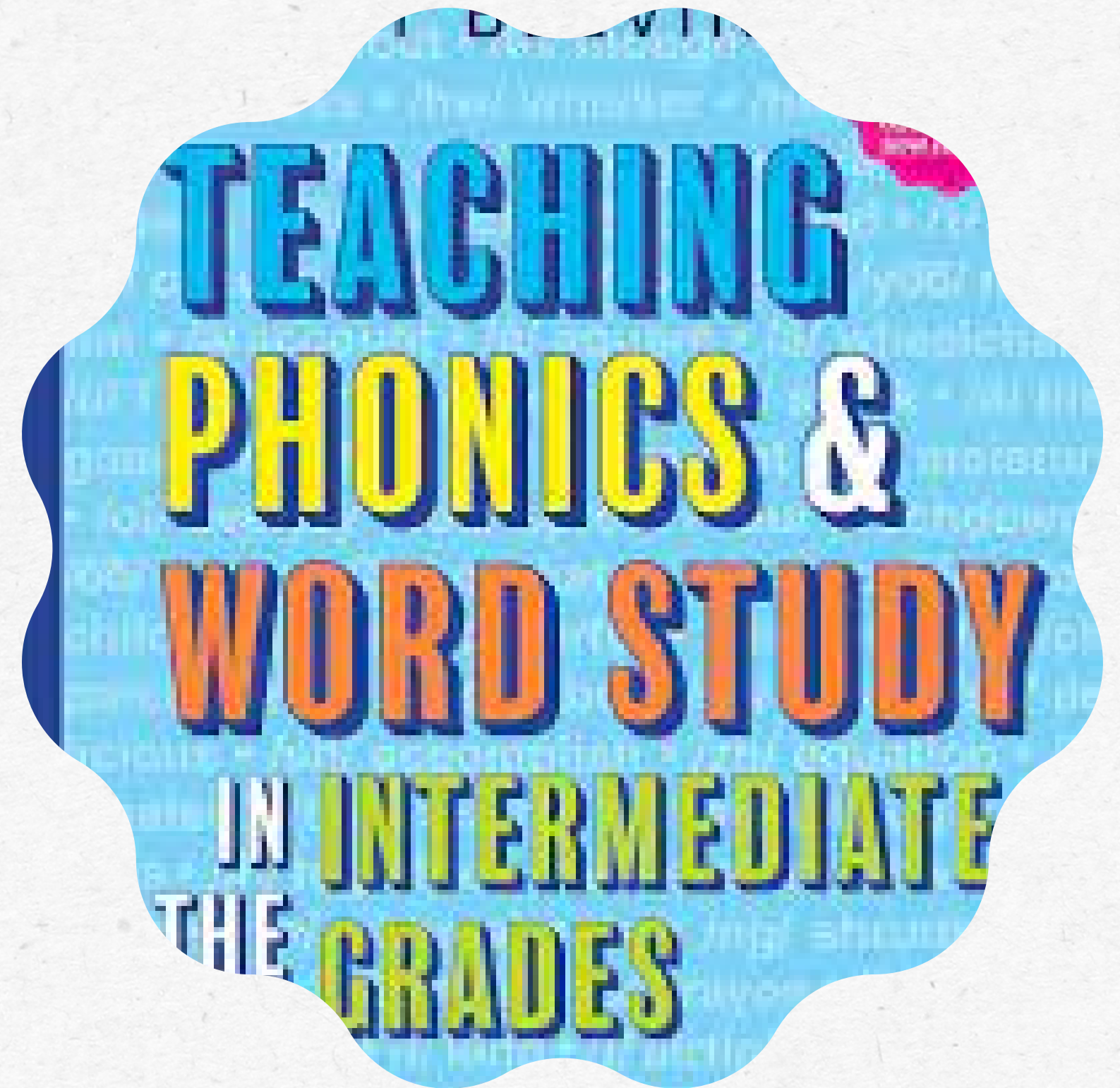


SUMMARY
